One of Jesus's closest friends was a man called John. A long time after Jesus went back to heaven, John had a vision of heaven. He saw all the Christians who ever lived on earth. They were singing this prayer to God.

The prayer of all the Christians:

'Great and wonderful are the things you do, Lord God All-Powerful. Right and true are your ways, Ruler of the nations. All people will fear you, O Lord. All people will praise your name. Only you are holy. All people will come and worship before you, because it is clear that you do what is right.'

(Revelation chapter 15 verses 3-4, ERV)



There are lots of things that might make us say 'Wow!' to God. When we think about how good he is or how strong he is, we say 'Wow!' When we think about how he made the world and us too, we say 'Wow!'. It is good for us to think about these things. It reminds us how big God is. It reminds us that he is in charge of everything. Nothing is too hard for him.

Set an alarm for 1 minute. Close your eyes and think about what God is like and what he has done. After the minute is up, use the next page to write your own 'Wow!' prayer to God. Then you can say it to God in your head or out loud.

All Kinds of Prayers: Help!

Hezekiah was the King of Judah (part of Israel). The King of Assyria was getting ready to attack him. Hezekiah was scared because the King of Assyria was very powerful. But he knew God was even more powerful. So he prayed this prayer to ask God for help.

King Hezekiah's prayer:

'You alone are the God who rules all the kingdoms on earth. You made heaven and earth. Lord, please listen to me. Lord, open your eyes and look at this message... You are the Lord our God, so please save us from the king of Assyria. Then all the other nations will know that you, Lord, are the only God.'

(2 Kings chapter 19 verses 15-19, ERV)



We can ask God for help with anything. When we or someone we love are in trouble, we can say 'Help!' When we hear about bad things happening in the world, we can say 'Help!'. And when we don't know what to do, we can ask God to help us make good choices. God doesn't always make our problems go away. But he does promise that he will be with us to help us.

All Kinds of Prayers: Sorry!

David was the King of Israel. Most of the time he did good things. But once he did a terrible thing. He had sex with another man's wife. Then he made sure that man got killed so he could marry her. Soon everyone found out. David knew he was wrong. So he said this prayer to God.

King David's prayer:

God, be merciful to me because of your faithful love. Because of your great compassion, erase all the wrongs I have done. Scrub away my guilt. Wash me clean from my sin. I know I have done wrong. I remember that sin all the time. I did what you said is wrong... You want me to be completely loyal, so put true wisdom deep inside of me. Remove my sin and make me pure. Wash me until I am whiter than snow!

(Psalms chapter 51 verses 1-7, ERV)



We all do things that are wrong. Sometimes we feel bad about these things. When we know we have done something wrong, it is good to say 'Sorry!' to God and to anyone we have hurt. We might still have to live with the result of what we did. But God forgives us when we are sorry for what we have done. And he helps us do the right thing next time.

Set an alarm for 1 minute. Close your eyes and ask God if there is anything you need to say sorry for. After the minute is up, use the next page to write and say your own 'Sorry!' prayer to God. If you need to say sorry to anyone else, you can do that too.

(1 Chronicles chapter 29 verses 11, 14, 17, ERV)



(Acts chapter 4 verses 28-30, ERV)



One of the things God asks us to do is to tell people the good news about Jesus. Sometimes that can be scary. In some countries it is dangerous. When we are scared to talk about Jesus we can say 'Make me bold!' And when we pray for Christians in those other countries, we can say 'Make them bold!' God promises to give us power to say what he wants us to say, even when it is hard.

Set an alarm for 1 minute. Close your eyes and think about someone you love who doesn't know Jesus yet, and about the Christians who are in prison for talking about Jesus. After the minute is up, use the next page to write and say your own 'Make me bold! prayer to God.
